Dear Friends,

At the end of the month, we will celebrate Holy Week and Easter. As I write, we are about halfway through Lent, our season of preparing our hearts for Easter. Holy Week is the culmination of that preparation.

On Maundy Thursday at 7 p.m. we celebrate Our Lord's last supper with his disciples, including the washing of feet and the stripping of the altar. It is a memorable liturgy – and participation in the footwashing is optional.

On Good Friday, we will have Stations of the Cross at noon, and the Good Friday liturgy at 7 p.m., with communion from the Reserved Sacrament. This solemn service fills our senses and our hearts with the sorrowful majesty of Our Lord in his last hours on earth.

Our joyous services on Easter will be at the usual times, 8 a.m. (no music) and 10 a.m. (with music).

We are active participants in the journey with Jesus, from the entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, to his trial and crucifixion, culminating in the glory of his resurrection on Easter Day.

Wherever you are in your own journey, God loves you and is calling you into fuller, deeper life in fellowship with him and with your faith community.

NEW ANNOUNCEMENT

The Vestry is delighted to announce that on March 26, Joe Zollickoffer signed a letter of agreement to become our next Rector at Holy Trinity. He will begin on July 1. Joe is finishing his studies at Virginia Theological Seminary this spring and will graduate with a Master of Divinity on May 16. He was ordained to the Diaconate on January 12, 2019 and will be ordained to the Priesthood at 11 am on September 28 at the Cathedral of the Incarnation. Until then, he will celebrate a Deacon's mass at Holy Trinity using pre-consecrated bread and wine. Joe is a Marylander, who grew up in Catonsville. He holds a B.A. in history from the University of Baltimore and an M.S. in management from The University of Maryland University College. Before he entered seminary, Joe was in management at the Community College of Baltimore County. Joe and his family are currently living in Owings Mills, MD. He and his wife, Nicole, married in 2006 and have three daughters, Madison, age 8; Leah, age 6; and Abigail, age 3. Joe's ministry is focused on small-church ministry, outreach, and pastoral care. He has been a hospital chaplain at Johns Hopkins, Bayview, and chaplain at the Baltimore International Seafarers' Center where he remains involved in this very special mission.





WOMEN of HOLY TRINITY



Warden's Report

As I write this, I share with you a deep sadness at the death of our beloved parishioner, Deacon Joan Kelly. Joan and her son, Joe, discovered Holy Trinity in the early 1990s and quickly made it their home. At Holy Trinity Joan became the vital spirit behind events and projects too numerous to count. She expanded our outreach, participated in worship services as acolyte, LEM and lector, joined the Women of Holy Trinity, served on Altar Guild, and on the lawn crew.

She initiated the monthly Scrapbooking event and the annual Quarter Auction, both of which have provided funds essential for outreach. Scrapbooking funds also have contributed to the purchase or replacement of much needed equipment. Joan's driving force led to the installation of our playground. She began to explore a call to the ministry and after much study and discernment chose to pursue the path to ordination as a Deacon. We rejoiced with her at her ordination in June of 2017. Since that day she has brought her gifts and talents to Emmanuel Church, Bel Air, where last summer she started a reading camp. Perhaps her greatest gift is the network of love, compassion and support she established among all who came to know her.

We give our sincerest "thank you" to the members of our search committee, Joan Armstrong, Sally Carnohan, Bill de Rosset, Linda Michel, and Jerry Wolff for the time, thought and effort they expended on our behalf to identify a new Rector who could guide our Holy Trinity community.

TAKE NOTE: PALM SUNDAY

For the 10:00 service on Palm Sunday, we will begin in the parish hall with the Blessing of the Palms. We will then carry our palms in procession to and into the church.

If you are able, please come to the parish hall first.

If you are not able to walk from the parish hall to the church, then please go directly to the church. We will arrive shortly, palms in hand.

Who is a member of the church?

Every baptized Christian is a member of Christ's body, the church (what we sometimes call "the church universal"). However, membership in a particular church (congregation) is governed by the canons (rules) of that denomination.


In the Episcopal Church you become a member when the date of your baptism is written in the Parish Register. That happens in one of three ways:

1. You were baptized here and the priest recorded the baptism.
2. You were baptized in another Episcopal church and you have formally transferred to this congregation.
3. You were baptized in a church other than Episcopal and you requested that your baptism be recorded in the Parish Register of this church.

So – if you want to be a member of the Church of the Holy Trinity and you weren't baptized here, talk to Mtr. Annette about points 2 and 3 above. And if you've never been baptized, by all means talk to Mtr. Annette about baptism.

A gentle reminder

Many – probably most – parishioners have a favorite seating area in the nave, maybe even a particular favorite pew. However, please remember that there are no reserved seats at Holy Trinity, except for those serving at the altar. And please also remember that the ushers are here to help you find a seat where you can see, hear, and be comfortable.

Lay Eucharistic Visitors

Lay Eucharistic Visitors are persons authorized by the Church to bring consecrated bread and wine to parishioners who have been unable to attend services at church because of illness or infirmities. The prayer book contains a special, very short service called “Communion under Special Circumstances” which is used when communion is brought to persons at home or in hospitals or rehab facilities. Our parish has an increasing number of members who from time to time are not able to attend services for the reasons cited above, and the opportunity to receive a visit and communion at home has been well received and greatly appreciated. Please consider whether serving as a Lay Eucharistic Visitor might be a new ministry that you could undertake.



Lawn Maintenance for 2019

At this time the 2019 lawn maintenance staffing will match that of 2018. Boxwood Farms Nursery and Landscaping has agreed to take care of the cemetery area. This group has provided exceptional service in every aspect of the trade (workmanship, dependability, and property-sensitivity) for a very reasonable cost. The remainder of the 5-acre campus will be cut by Lawrason, Lawrie, and me. We will be using the HT-owned ZTR (Zero Turn Radius) and when needed, line trimmer (Weed eater).

Here is how you can help this ministry. More ZTR operators are needed, if for any reason,” to spread the load”. 3 people cutting all that grass for 6 months makes one weary. If you feel you would like to help but don’t have ZTR-operating experience, you will be trained until it is determined that you can operate the machine safely.

A sign-up sheet will be placed on the table in the back of the church very shortly. Please sign-up and indicate if you need training.
